

School Preparedness Plan to Meet County Guidance for COVID-19

VISITORS/VOLUNTEERS

The school allows only necessary visitors and volunteers on the campus and will limit the number of students and staff who come into contact with them.

FACE COVERINGS - We will support students and staff wearing masks by:

This is a private school on private property. Right to pass is granted only by Administration, and only on the condition of compliance with school policy. Masks are among the policy requirements. If a student or staff member forgets to bring one, we have a supply on hand. In addition to simply requiring it, reminders are posted throughout the campus, and students are educated about the reasons that support wearing a mask.

Applicable here and to all sections below: We are not subject to SB419, so we do not need to allow willful defiance anywhere on the property. High quality Remote Learning is available for at-risk students, students with at-risk household members, and students who cannot or will not comply with health and safety protocols on campus.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING - We will support physical distancing by:

In addition to requiring it, and teaching about it:

Desks are separated by 6' or 7', even though current guidelines only require 6' distance between the teacher and students. Students are reminded frequently of what close contact means, and that our goal is to have zero close contact events. Passing periods and breaks are closely monitored to ensure that we have no close contact events. Security video of any close contact event will be retained for a minimum of 14 days for the purpose of contact tracing. We take seriously the protection of individual safety, health, and privacy.

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

We will support cleaning and maintenance of our campus by:

Doing it ourselves because we want it done right.

In compliance with both filed Social Distancing Protocol forms and following guidance in COVID-19 PREPARED: Reopening of Santa Clara County K-12 Schools for the 2020-2021 School Year (9/21 Rev)

HYGIENE - We will support routine and frequent handwashing by:

Signage is posted at the entrance and at various locations within the building.

Encourage frequent handwashing and provide frequent breaks for handwashing. Trash cans have been moved to outside each rest room, and we have placed a notice by the sinks stating: Trash cans are now outside. Wash your hands. Dry your hands. Use the paper towel to open the door. Dispose of paper towel. (This enhances awareness of shared surfaces, such as door handles, and also makes it apparent if someone exits having not washed hands.)

At arrival: students' hands are sprayed with sanitizer after temperature check.

Sanitizer is available in every room, as a second choice alternative to washing with soap and water.

ROUTINE TESTING - We will encourage and support staff testing by:

By saying, "Hey, we encourage and support it. Do you need to come in late or leave early to do it? We've already let you know where and how to do it as part of the other Social Distancing Protocol training. If they try to charge you, go ahead and pay, and we'll reimburse you."

This was already part of the Social Distancing Protocol training:
